WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio (the "City") has entered into a Public Hospital Agencies Agreement (the "Hospital Agencies Agreement"), dated June 1, 2005, providing authorization for the issuance by the County of Franklin, Ohio ("Franklin County"), acting by and through the County Hospital Commission of Franklin County, of bonds of Franklin County, from time to time, to finance and refinance the acquisition, construction, installation, and equipping of Hospital Facilities (as defined in Section 140.01(E) of the Ohio Revised Code) for the benefit of Portage Trail Care Center (d/b/a Traditions at Bath Road), an Ohio nonprofit corporation (the "Borrower"), which Hospital Agencies Agreement remains in effect; and

CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, PURSUANT TO SECTION

147 OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS

AMENDED, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Franklin County has determined to issues its Adjustable Rate Demand Health Care Facilities Revenue Bonds (Traditions Healthcare Obligated Group), Series 2013 (the "Bonds"), such Bonds to be issued in the maximum aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$5,000,000, of which approximately \$900,000 of the proceeds of the Bonds will be made available to the Borrower to (i) finance and refinance the acquisition, construction, installation, and equipping of hospital facilities owned by the Borrower and located at 300 East Bath Road, in the City of Cuyahoga Falls, Summit County, Ohio (the "Bath Road Project"), including the general renovation and upgrade of the facility, (ii) reimburse the Borrower for costs associated with the Bath Road Project, and (iii) pay certain costs of issuance of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, following publication on April 26, 2013 in the Falls News Press, which is a newspaper of general circulation in the City, there was held on May 13, 2013 a public hearing with respect to the Project in accordance with Section 147 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 147 of the Code, this City Council, as the "applicable elected representative" for purposes of such Section, has determined to approve the issuance of the Bonds,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1</u>. This City Council, as the "applicable elected representative" of the City hereby approves the issuance of the Bonds in the maximum aggregate amount

not to exceed \$5,000,000, on behalf of the Borrower and affiliates of the Borrower for the purposes set forth in this Ordinance.

Section 2. All resolutions and ordinances, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed. If any section, paragraph or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

 <u>Section 3</u>. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this City Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this City Council, and that all deliberations of this City Council that resulted in those formal actions, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22, Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City, and for the further reason that this Ordinance is required to be immediately effective in order to issue and sell the Bonds, which is necessary to finance the Bath Road Project, which will further promote the public purpose stated in Section 140.01 of the Ohio Revised Code; wherefore this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
