AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE PLANNING COMMISSION APPROVAL, FINDINGS AND CONDITIONS OF THE JUZO SITE PLAN AT 3690 ZORN DRIVE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Cuyahoga Falls requires that all decisions made by the Planning Commission be submitted to Council, and

WHEREAS, on May 19, 2015 the Planning Commission recommended approval of the site plan for the construction of a 14,400 square foot warehouse/distribution addition at 3690 Zorn Drive.

WHEREAS, such approval is given subject to conditions subsequent to be satisfied, and

WHEREAS, such approval is necessary to determine that the site plan is satisfactory, serves the public interest, and is acceptable for recording.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:


<u>Section 1.</u> The City Council approves the site plan for the construction of a 14,400 square foot warehouse/distribution addition at 3690 Zorn Drive, in accordance with Cuyahoga Falls General Development Code regulations as stipulated in the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and as approved by the Planning Commission as per the plans and final stipulations contained in Project File MSP-15-00012.

<u>Section 2.</u> Any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

<u>Section 3.</u> It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

<u>Section 4.</u> This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, for the reason that it is immediately necessary to permit timely and appropriate development of this property, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. -2015

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 516.02 OF PART FIVE OF THE CODIFIED CHAPTER 516, ORDINANCES, RELATING TO MINORS' CURFEW, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Council to protect minors in this city from harm and victimization, to promote the safety and well-being of minors residing in and visiting this city, and to reduce the incidence of crime and violence committed by and against minors, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council, formed in 2015 as a collaboration between the Mayor's office and the future leaders of Cuyahoga Falls, is designed to encourage students to become active in their local government by sharing ideas and offering input on important topics, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council discussed the matter of Cuyahoga Falls' curfew in a responsible and thorough manner, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council proposed an amendment which is consistent with the stated intent and governmental interests of the minor curfew enacted in 2011, and

WHEREAS, a modest extension in the minor curfew will recognize the contribution of the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council and, thus, allow citizens of all ages to have a voice in local government.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. Section 516.02 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls are hereby amended to read in full as follows (new text underlined; deleted text in strikethrough):

516.02 CURFEW HOURS.

- (a) Subject to the provisions of subsection (b) below, no person under eighteen years of age shall be in or upon any public place during the period beginning at 11:00 p.m. daily except Friday and Saturday when such curfew hour shall begin at 12:00 midnight, and ending at 5:00 a.m. the following morning.
- (b) No person under eighteen years of age who is not a lawful resident of the Special Curfew Area shall be in or upon any public place in the Special Curfew Area during the period beginning at 98:00 p.m. daily and ending at 5:00 a.m. the following morning.
- (c) The Mayor may suspend the operation of subsection (b) of this section to allow unaccompanied minors to attend events or programming designed for children or youth under eighteen years of age, provided that the event or programming is free of

alcoholic beverages. If held on City-owned property, the rental agreement entered into between the City and the event sponsor for use of the property may contain such further conditions as required to ensure the safety of unaccompanied minors. Any suspension authorized by the Mayor shall be issued in writing and shall specify the dates to which it applies.

(d) Any minor violating the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of an act of unruliness.

Section 2. If any section, subsection, paragraph, clause or provision or any part thereof of this ordinance shall be finally adjudicated by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall be unaffected by such adjudication and all the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect as though such section, subsection, paragraph, clause or provision or any part thereof so adjudicated to be invalid had not, to the extent of such invalidity, been included herein.

Section 5.
