

Section 2. The Director of Public Service is authorized to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, for the demolition of the dangerous buildings listed in Section 1 above, and removal of debris therefrom.

Section 3. The Finance Director is authorized to make payment for same from the Capital Projects Fund.

<u>Section 4.</u> In accordance with the Ohio Revised Code §715.26, the Finance Director is hereby directed to certify the costs of demolition and debris removal to the Clerk of Council who shall then certify the same to the Summit County Fiscal Officer for placement thereof on the tax duplicate together with interest and penalties provided by law.

Section 5. A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR AND URGING PASSAGE OF ISSUE 8, SUMMIT COUNTY CHILDREN SERVICES TAX LEVY, AT THE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 6, 2018, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Summit County Children Services (SCCS) is seeking voter approval of a 2.25-mill renewal levy with a 1 mill increase on the November 6, 2018 ballot; and

WHEREAS, SCCS received 10,723 total intake calls in 2017 relative to the well-being of children; and

WHEREAS, SCCS provided services to 9,719 children in 2017, which is 1 out of every 12 children in Summit County; and

WHEREAS, despite seeing a decrease of \$58.6 million since 2008, SCCS provides exceptional services to children and families in Summit County while having a 36% increase in the number of children in its custody since 2012 largely impacted by the ongoing opioid crisis; and

WHEREAS, after tens of millions of dollars in cuts to funding, continued progress in child welfare depends on passing the levy; and

WHEREAS, without a levy, SCCS must cut 34% of its staff and reduce its budget by 20%, as well as eliminate and reduce essential programs that have a direct positive impact on the children and families of Summit County; and

WHEREAS, SCCS has not asked for a levy increase in 30 years and has twice reduced its levy amount; and

WHEREAS, the levy increase will cost the average (\$100,000) homeowner less than 10 cents per day or \$35 per year; and

WHEREAS, the futures of the children of Summit County depend upon the quality of our children services agency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:
