AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 505 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES, RELATING TO ANIMALS AND OTHER FOWL IN THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City desires to protect the health, safety and welfare of its residents and pets by requiring owners to use a leash when their dogs are off the owners' property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1.</u> Chapter 505, Animals and other Fowl, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls is hereby amended and/or supplemented to read in full as follows (new text <u>double underlined</u>; deleted text in <u>strikethrough</u>):

CHAPTER 505

505.01 DEFINITIONS.

As used in this chapter, certain terms are defined as follows:

- (a) "Whoever" includes owner, keeper, handler or harborer.
- (b) "Owner" includes keeper, handler or harborer.
- (c) "Registration tag" means the metal tag issued annually by the County Auditor evidencing a registered dog.
- (d) "Registered dog" means a dog registered in compliance with Ohio R.C. Chapter 955.
- (e) "Permit to run at large" means running at will, roaming away from the premises of the owner, acting on its own initiative and not on leash or under the immediate control of the owner.
- (f) "Impound" means to seize summarily, confine and retain in custody of law.
- (g) "Animal" includes dogs, cats, cattle, sheep, horses, geese, ducks, turkeys, chickens or other fowl or any other animal, domestic or wild, maintained or kept as a pet, for work or for a product.

505.02 DOGS AND OTHER ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE.

- (a) No person being the owner or having charge of any fowl or animal shall permit such fowl or animal to run at large upon any public place, or upon any unenclosed lands, or upon the premises of another. The owner or person having charge of every animal shall at all times keep such animal either confined upon the premises of the owner or keeper, or on leash—under reasonable control of some person held in the hand of a person in a manner which continuously controls the animal. The provisions of this subsection (a) shall not apply to cats running at large in that portion of the City formerly known as Northampton Township.
- (b) No person being the owner of or having charge of any dog, whether wearing a registration tag or not, shall permit it to run at large upon any public place or upon the premises of another. No owner, keeper or harborer of any female dog

shall permit such dog to go beyond the premises of such owner or keeper at any time such dog is in heat, unless such dog is properly in leash.

- (c) The running at large of any such animal in or upon any of the places mentioned in this section is prima-facie evidence that it is running at large in violation of this section.
- (d) It shall be an affirmative defense to a violation of this section that the animal was:
 - (1) Securely confined in a vehicle or cage which was adequately ventilated while off the premises of the owner;
 - (2) Being used for lawful hunting purposes or training for the purpose of hunting while accompanied by a license number;
 - (3) Being exhibited at a public show, zoo, museum, or public institution;
 - (4) Engaged in activity expressly approved by the laws of the State; or
 - (5) Owned by a public law enforcement agency or licensed private law enforcement agency or member thereof and the animal was being utilized for law enforcement purposes.
- (e) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor for a first offense and a misdemeanor of the fourth degree for each subsequent offense.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE SUBMISSION TO THE ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS A PROPOSAL TO AMEND ARTICLE V, SECTION 2 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, TO ESTABLISH A MAY PRIMARY ELECTION DATE FOR MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS IN THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, IN ORDER TO REDUCE THE COST OF THE PRIMARY ELECTION FOR CUYAHOGA FALLS TAXPAYERS AND UPHOLD THE VOTING RIGHTS OF OVERSEAS MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS, TO BE VOTED UPON AT THE NEXT REGULAR CITY-WIDE ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 6, 2018, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the state primary election is in May pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3501.01(E)(1) which states, in relevant part, that "Primary elections shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in May of each year except in years in which a presidential primary election is held"; and

WHEREAS, currently the City of Cuyahoga Falls holds its primary elections in September pursuant to Article V, Section 2 of the Charter of the City of Cuyahoga Falls which establishes the date for the primary election for municipal elections in the City as the "8th Tuesday prior to such regular [general] municipal election"; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment to Article V, Section 2 of the Charter will establish a primary election date for municipal elections within the City of Cuyahoga Falls consistent with the May primary election date established by the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, because the September primary election date is so close to the November general election date, September primary elections make it difficult and, in some instances, impossible for the Board of Elections to prepare complete ballots by the deadline prescribed by federal and state law for preparing ballots for use by military and overseas voters; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3511.04, each county Board of Elections shall mail absentee ballots to military service members serving overseas (following proper application) "not later than the forty-fifth day before the day of each general or primary election"; and

WHEREAS, as currently provided for in the Charter, there are only 56 days between the municipal primary election and the general election; therefore, there are

only 11 days after the primary election before the state-mandated deadline for mailing general election absentee ballots to military service members serving overseas; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3513.22, the county Board of Elections has 21 days following the primary election to complete the Official Canvass of the primary election, which is ten days after the state-mandated deadline for mailing general election absentee ballots to military service members serving overseas; and

WHEREAS, moving the municipal primary election date to May will enable the Board of Elections to properly comply with the voting rights of military service members serving overseas by providing sufficient time for the results of the primary election to be certified prior to the state-mandated deadline for mailing general election absentee ballots to such military service members; and

WHEREAS, moving the City of Cuyahoga Falls primary election to the same date as the state primary election date in May is expected to result in significant cost-savings to Cuyahoga Falls taxpayers because, in larger elections, a larger number of political subdivisions share in the expense of the election, thereby decreasing the per-precinct amount charged to each political subdivision; and

WHEREAS, according to the Summit County Board of Elections, if the City of Cuyahoga Falls had moved the September primary election to May, in 2017, the City of Cuyahoga Falls taxpayers could have saved approximately \$48,349.79; and

WHEREAS, the May primary election traditionally has a higher voter turnout than the September primary election (45.86% higher, on average, in the last four municipal election years); and

WHEREAS, moving the primary election date to May will protect the rights of overseas military service members, save taxpayer funds, enhance voter turnout, and therefore moving the municipal primary date to May is in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Cuyahoga Falls.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

This Council hereby authorizes and directs the submission to the electors of the City of Cuyahoga Falls at the next regular City-wide election to be held at the usual places of voting in said City on November 6, 2018, between the hours of 6:30 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. Eastern Standard Time of said day, of a proposal to amend the Charter of the City of Cuyahoga Falls.

The ballots for said election shall, at the top thereof, be entitled "City Section 2. of Cuyahoga Falls Proposed Charter Amendment" and the question to be separately submitted on said ballots shall be as follows:

> Charter Issue No. - Shall the proposed amendment to the Charter of the City of Cuyahoga Falls amending Article V, Section 2 thereof be adopted so that, as amended, the section shall provide as follows:

101 102 **ARTICLE V, SECTION 2 - NOMINATIONS** 103 104 TO REDUCE THE COST OF THE PRIMARY ELECTION 105 AND UPHOLD THE VOTING RIGHTS OF OVERSEAS 106 MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS, Candidates for all offices 107 at any regular municipal election under the provisions of 108 this Charter, with the exception of candidates for the office 109 of Judge of the Municipal Court, Clerk of Municipal Court, 110 other candidates who are elected by electors from both 111 within and without the City and/or independent candidates 112 for any other elective municipal office, shall be nominated 113 at a primary election to be held on the 8th Tuesday prior to 114 such regular municipal election FIRST TUESDAY AFTER THE FIRST MONDAY IN MAY.  WHEREAS, Subpart C of Part 91, Title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations requires that the City submit, as a part of the annual submission of its consolidated plan, an action plan that includes a certification that the consolidated plan is authorized under state and local law and that the City possesses the legal authority to carry out the programs for which it is seeking funding,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1.</u> The 2018 Community Development Block Grant Annual Action Plan, and the programs contained in the City's consolidated plan, are hereby approved, and the Community Development Department is authorized to carry out the programs contained in these documents.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Director of Finance is hereby authorized to increase appropriations in the Community Development Block Grant Fund, Line item, Other Operations by \$630,022 and decrease appropriations in the same fund, line item, Capital Outlay by \$100,000.

<u>Section 3.</u> Any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

<u>Section 4.</u> It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

<u>Section 5.</u> This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
