A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE BROWNFIELD REDEVELOPMENT PLAN SUBMITTED FOR THE PROPOSED SCHWEBEL FLEX INDUSTRIAL AND TECHNOLOGY CENTER, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on December 20, 2011 the Planning Commission approved the voluntary submission of the brownfield redevelopment plan for the proposed Schwebel Flex Industrial and Technology Center, to be located on approximately 13 acres of contiguous parcels at 1950 Newberry Avenue (Parcel No. 02-18449), 310 Tallmadge Road (Parcel No. 02-19506) and 406 Tallmadge Road (Parcel No. 02-18447), entirely within the City of Cuyahoga Falls; and

WHEREAS, this Council wishes to express its support of the plan for remediation and reuse of this industrial site,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1.</u> This Council approves the Brownfield Redevelopment Plan voluntarily submitted in association with the proposed Schwebel Flex Industrial and Technology Center, as approved by the Planning Commission as per all plans and stipulations contained in File P-19-11 S (copy of the preliminary site plan attached hereto as Exhibit "A.").

<u>Section 2.</u> It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

Section 3. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, for the reason that it is immediately necessary to permit timely and appropriate development of this property, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
