


Figure 1 -- Phase 2 Subdivision Plat




Figure 2 -- Phase 3 Subdivision Plat

REPEALING ORDINANCE 73-2001 WHICH REOUIRED THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO TRANSFER FUNDS GENERATED BY THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE KILOWATT-HOUR DISTRIBUTION TAX FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE ELECTRIC FUND, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 3, which became effective July 6, 1999, created a kilowatt-hour distribution tax that is to be paid by electric distribution companies to the State of Ohio for electricity distributed to end users; and

WHEREAS, the kilowatt hour distribution tax is calculated by applying the rates found in Ohio Revised Code Section 5727.81(A) the amount of kilowatt hours of electricity distributed to end users by an electric distribution company; and

WHEREAS, a municipality that operates a municipally owned electric utility that distributes electricity to an end user comes within the definition of an electric distribution company and is therefore required to calculate the kilowatt-hour distribution tax, in the manner set forth in Ohio Revised Code Section 5727.81(A), based on the amount of kilowatt hours of electricity that the municipality distributes to end users both inside and outside of the municipal corporate boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 5727.82(A)(3) states that a municipal electric utility that is required to calculate the kilowatt-hour distribution tax may retain in the municipality's General fund that portion of the tax calculated on kilowatt hours of electricity distributed to end users within the boundaries of the municipal corporation, and the tax calculated on kilowatt hours of electricity distributed by a municipal electric utility to end users outside the boundaries of the municipal corporation must be remitted to the State; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls operates a municipal electric utility that is required to calculate the tax on the kilowatt hours of electricity distributed to end users located inside and outside of the municipality's corporate boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the kilowatt-hour distribution tax attributed to the distribution of electricity to end users located within the corporate boundaries of the municipality is deposited in the municipality's General Fund; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 73-2001 required that these funds then be transferred to the municipality's Electric Fund; and

WHEREAS, City Council should have the authority to determine whether these funds remain in the General Fund pursuant to state law or be transferred to the Electric Fund as the needs of the City dictate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. Council hereby repeals Ordinance No. 73-2001.

<u>Section 2</u>. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 929.021 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, OHIO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the recommended revision will provide additional resources to address storm water issues in the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. Paragraphs (a) and (c) of Section 929.021 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls are hereby amended as follows with the remainder of Section 929.021 to remain unchanged (new text <u>double underlined</u>; deleted text in strikethrough):

929.021 Storm Drainage Utility Charges and Rates

- Effective January 1, 2007-2020, there is hereby levied and imposed a charge for storm (a) drainage services, as provided in Section 929.02 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, upon all lots and lands within the City of Cuyahoga Falls which have been improved by the construction or installation of improvements with impervious surfaces including but not limited to structures, driveways, access roads and parking lots. The rate for each improved property in the City shall be \$3.00 \$5.00 per month multiplied by the number of basic service units assigned to that property.
- Section 2. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portion of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.
- Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.
- Section 4. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it received the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon it passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 933 "ELECTRICITY" OF TITLE 5 "PUBLIC UTILITIES" OF PART 9 "STREETS AND PUBLIC SERVICES" OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, OHIO RELATING TO ELECTRIC RATES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, a recently completed electric rate study indicates the need to revise the City's retail electric rates in order to accurately reflect the existing costs of furnishing electric service;

WHEREAS, the recommended revision will result in a better representation to the City's retail customers of the cost of providing such electric services; and

WHEREAS, the cause for the revision is founded in the fact that the cost of providing electric service has risen since the rates were last established;

WHEREAS, electric rates must be revised to meet the Cuyahoga Falls electric system debt covenants.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. Chapter 933 "Electricity" of Title 5 "Public Utilities" of Part 9 "Streets and Public Services" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls be amended to read as follows (new text double underlined; deleted text in strikethrough):

933.02 SCHEDULE RS-RESIDENTIAL SERVICE.

- Availability. Available where secondary distribution lines are adjacent to the premises to be served. Applies to electric service, other than three phase service, all domestic purposes in private residences and single occupancy apartments. Where a portion of a residential unit is used for a purpose of commercial or public nature, the appropriate general service rate applies to all service. However, if the wiring is so arranged that the service for residential purposes can be metered separately this rate shall be applied to the residential service. The residential service rate does not apply to a commercial, institutional or industrial establishment.

923.02 SALE OF WATER BY DELIVERY OR AT PLANT TAP

(c) The charge for delivery shall be a flat fee of \$33.93 42.64 per delivery up to a maximum of 1,600 gallons per delivery. The Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to adjust this fee in January of each calendar year beginning in 2013 2020, provided that no annual adjustment, whether an increase or decrease, may be made in excess of 3% of the rate then in effect except by ordinance. Residents shall be billed for said water delivery through the City's Utility Billing office.

Section 2. The amendments set forth in Section 1 of this Ordinance shall be effective January 1, 2020 or the effective date of this Ordinance, whichever is later.

Section 3. Existing sections 923.01 and 923.02 of the Codified Ordinances, as amended by Ord. 112-2011, passed December 27, 2011, is hereby repealed effective as of the effective date of Section 1 of this ordinance.

Section 4. Any ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

Section 6. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
