AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE UTILITY WORKERS UNION OF AMERICA, LOCAL 399 EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Chapter 4117 authorizes public employees to bargain collectively with public employers regarding wages, hours, terms and other conditions of employment and to enter into collective bargaining agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and his representatives and the Utility Workers' Union of America, Local 399 (UWUA) have bargained collectively and in good faith and said bargaining has resulted in a collective bargaining agreement covering various classifications of employees effective July 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, on or about February 9, 2022, the membership of the UWUA ratified said collective bargaining agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a collective bargaining agreement as negotiated with and ratified by the Utility Workers Union of America, Local 399 effective July 1, 2021.

Section 2. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 3. AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TO AMEND THE COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AREA TAX EXEMPTION AGREEMENT WITH LEGACY 2020, LLC TO REFLECT THE NAME CHANGE TO CF LEGACY 2020, LLC AND TO AMEND THE SCOPE OF WORK TO REFLECT A CHANGE IN TOTAL NUMBER OF MULTI-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL UNITS, RETAIL SPACE, AND INVESTMENT DOLLARS INITIALLY APPROVED UNDER THIS COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT TAX EXEMPTION AGREEMENT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 95-2004, passed June 30, 2004, this Council established and designated the boundaries of the Cuyahoga River Community Reinvestment Area ("CRA") pursuant to Ohio Revised Code §3735.65 et seq. to encourage the development of real property within the CRA; and

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio Director of Development (formerly known as the State of Ohio Development Service Agency) has made a determination that the findings contained in Ordinance No. 95-2004 are valid, and that the classification of structures and/or remodeling eligible exemption under the Ordinance is consistent with zoning restrictions applicable to the CRA; and

WHEREAS, with the receipt of the Director's positive determination, the City is enabled to abate certain taxes on real property located in the CRA, in order to provide an incentive for the creation of jobs and investment within the CRA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 30-2020, passed April 28, 2020, this Council approved a Community Reinvestment Area tax exemption on behalf of Legacy 2020, LLC., in connection with its redevelopment of 2020 Front Street, Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio 44221 (Parcel #0202834), to convert the existing office building, now known as Towne Center, into 38 multifamily residential apartment units, with first floor retail consisting of approximately 7,000 square feet, all at an approximate cost of ten million three hundred twenty-eight thousand dollars (\$10,328,000.00); and

WHEREAS, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this redevelopment project was delayed, but is now ready to commence after passage and approval of this amended Community Reinvestment Area Tax Exemption Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the name of the owner of the aforementioned real property will now be CF Legacy 2020, LLC, and this name change requires an amendment to the prior CRA Agreement and filing with the State of Ohio Department of Development (formerly known as the State of Ohio Development Services Agency); and

WHEREAS, the scope of this project has changed from 38 multi-family residential apartment units, and first floor retail space consisting of 7,000 square feet, to 34 multi-family residential apartment units with zero first floor retail space conversion. The new project cost is ten million three hundred twenty-four thousand one-hundred ten dollars (\$10,324,110.00). This change in the scope of work also requires an amendment to the prior CRA Agreement and filing with the State of Ohio Department of Development (formerly known as the State of Ohio Development Service Agency).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

 Section 1. The Director of Community Development is hereby authorized to amend the Community Reinvestment Area tax exemption agreement in accordance with Ohio Revised Code §§3735.67 and 3735.671 with Legacy 2020, LLC to reflect the name change to CF Legacy 2020, LLC and amend the scope of work to consist of the construction of 34 multi-family residential apartment units with zero first floor retail space at a total investment of ten million three hundred twenty-four thousand one-hundred ten dollars (\$10,324,110.00), consistent with Ordinance 95-2004 and the terms set forth in the amended application attached hereto as Exhibit A, to provide the Project with an exemption from real property tax at the same percentage and for the same duration as previously approved by Ordinance 30-2020.

<u>Section 2.</u> This Council further authorizes the Mayor, Director of Finance, Director of Community Development, Director of Law, and any other public officials, individually and/or collectively as may be appropriate, to prepare and execute such other documents and do other things as are necessary or incidental to carrying out the requirements of this legislation consistent with the terms of the attached amended application.

<u>Section 3.</u> Any ordinance or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

<u>Section 4.</u> It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

<u>Section 5.</u> This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary of the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience, and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
