ORDINANCE NO. 99 - 2022

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 181, CONTRACTS AND COMPETITIVE BIDDING, OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, OHIO TO UPDATE THE DEFINITION OF LOWEST AND BEST BID, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls is required by law to award certain contracts to the lowest and best bidders; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Cuyahoga Falls, based upon its experience, discretion, and consideration of other objective evidence, has determined that quality of workmanship, efficient operation, safety, and timely completion of projects are not necessarily insured by awarding a construction project to the lowest bidder; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Cuyahoga Falls has determined that the "lowest and best" bidder for purchase of goods or a construction project must be identified by use of the several factors in addition the dollar amount of the bid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1.</u> Chapter 181, Contracts and Competitive Bidding, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls is hereby is hereby supplemented as follow (new text <u>double underlined</u>; deleted text in <del>strikethrough</del>):

## 181.08 LOCAL PREFERENCE.

- (a) In determining the lowest and best bid for supplies, commodities, materials, equipment, furnishings or general services, the Board of Control shall exercise a preference for local bidders as provided herein. The local preference shall also apply to contracts for the building, repair or renovation of public buildings or improvements.
- (b) Bidders having established their principal place of business, defined as a business with a significant economic and physical presence in Cuyahoga Falls for two successive calendar years prior to the bid opening date, shall be preferred as lowest <u>and best</u> if their bids does not exceed by more than three percent (3%), with an upper limit of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), the apparent lowest <u>and best</u> bid.
- (c) To qualify for local preference, bidders shall state on the bid documents their principal place of business, the business address where work will be administered (post office boxes will not be accepted in lieu of a street address) and the date of establishment. Each bidder shall have only one principal place of business.

- (d) Local preferences shall not be applied as provided herein for any bids where prohibited by federal or state laws or regulations.
- (e) Local preferences shall only be applied in considering the lowest <u>and best bid</u>. and shall not waive or nullify evaluation of which bidders are responsive and responsible. In no event shall any preference granted herein exceed a maximum of three percent (3%) or ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), whichever is less.
- (f) The City shall indicate in all its invitations to bid and specification for all public contractors for supplies, equipment and materials, excluding construction contracts and contracts financed in whole or in part by contributions or loans from any agency of the State of Ohio or United States Government, that it shall apply a local bid preference as outlined in this section in the evaluation and award of bids received.

## 181.09 Lowest and Best Bid Defined

(a) The City will award contracts to the lowest and best bidder. The following factors are significant in determining whether a bid is the lowest and best bid and may be considered and applied by city officials, in their discretion, when determining the lowest and best bid for supplies, commodities, materials, equipment, furnishings or construction, renovation, maintenance, repair, businesses or general services.

- 1. The bidder's familiarity with the project.
- 2. Adequacy of the equipment for the project.
- 3. The bidder's record on similar projects.
- 4. The bidder's experience in the relevant field in the preceding twelve months, including the original contract price for each job undertaken and the cost of any change order and overruns.
- 5. The bidder's compliance with deadlines.
- 6. <u>The bidder's prior performance on any project taken for the City of Cuyahoga Falls.</u>
- 7. The bidder's financial solvency.
- 8. Whether the bidder has ever sued or been sued by a public entity over a public project.
- 9. The bidder's bonding record.
- 10. The bidder's compliance record with, and maintenance of, unemployment and workers' compensation laws for all employees.
- 11. The bidder's compliance record with, and maintenance of, federal and state wage laws for all employees.
- 12. The bidder's compliance record with, and maintenance of, the Fair Labor Standards Act for all employees.
- 13. The bidder's compliance record with, and maintenance of, Occupational Safety and Health Administration regulations for all employees.
- 14. The experience, training, and skill of the bidder's workforce in writing.
- 15. The number of years the bidder has been in the relevant businesses.
- 16. The continuity of the bidder's workforce.
- 17. The bidder's past compliance with employee drug testing.

- 97 18. Past compliance with local and state income tax laws.
  - 19. The bidder's participation in a state accredited apprenticeship program when it is required by Ohio prevailing wage law.
  - 20. Any other factor determined to be relevant.

(b) Bid specifications shall contain provisions conforming to Section (a) of this chapter. Evidence of the factors they wish to be considered is the responsibility of the bidder.

(c) City Officials may reject any or all bids, or parts of bids, for any reason if acceptance is not in the best interest of the City.

<u>Section 2.</u> Any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

<u>Section 3.</u> That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

 <u>Section 4.</u> This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
