A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE SUMMIT COUNTY 9-1-1 PLAN AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 128.06 establishes that every county shall maintain a county 9-1-1 Program Review Committee and that committee shall maintain and approve a plan for implementing and operating the county 9-1-1 system (the "Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the Plan identifies each of the Public Safety Answering Points ("PSAPs") in the County, indicates how they operate, the expense of operation, and establishes processes for expending funds that the County receives from the State of Ohio 9-1-1 Government Assistance Fund; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 128.08 requires that the final plan shall be adopted by the legislative authorities of municipal corporations and townships that contain at least sixty percent of the county's population; and

WHEREAS, the Plan was updated in coordination with representatives from each PSAP located in Summit County; and

WHEREAS, the updated Plan was subsequently approved by the Summit County 9-1-1 Program Review Committee on March 27, 2024; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County of Summit to approve and adopt the aforementioned 9-1-1 Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Council and Administration hereby approve and adopt the Summit County 9-1-1 plan.

<u>Section 2.</u> It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

<u>Section 3.</u> This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
