9 A RESOLUTION CREATING FOR THE YEAR 2025 A SIDEWALK
10 AND DRIVE APPROACH REPAIR OR REPLACEMENT DISTRICT
11 CONTAINING SUCH STREETS, ALLEYS, OR PUBLIC ROADWAYS
12 WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA
13 FALLS, DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF REPAIRING OR
14 REPLACING THE SIDEWALKS AND DRIVE APPROACHES
15 ABUTTING ON SUCH STREETS, ALLEYS OR PUBLIC ROADWAYS
16 WITHIN SAID CORPORATE LIMITS AND PROVIDING THE
17 METHOD FOR LEVYING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS, AND
18 DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

19
20 WHEREAS, it is the opinion of this Council that certain sidewalks and drive approaches
21 abutting on the streets, alleys or public roadways within the City of Cuyahoga Falls are in
22 disrepair.

23
24 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County
25 of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

26
27 Section 1. A Sidewalk and Drive Approach Repair or Replacement District is hereby created
28 for the year 2025 containing those streets, alleys or public roadways within the corporate limits
29 of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, and declaring the necessity of repairing or replacing the sidewalks
30 and drive approaches abutting on such streets, alleys or public roadways, and to provide the
31 method for levying assessments and the right to object to or appeal said assessment.

32
33 Section 2. It is hereby declared that the repair or replacement of sidewalks and drive
34 approaches abutting on necessary streets, alleys and public roadways within the Sidewalk and
35 Drive Approach Repair or Replacement District is necessary and will be of general benefit within
36 the City and of special benefit to property owners abutting said sidewalks and drive approaches.

37
38 Section 3. Property abutting the necessary streets, alleys and public roadways receiving
39 sidewalk repair or replacement within the District may be assessed by the lineal foot of abutting
40 sidewalk at the rate of one-half of the total cost of installing or adjusting a linear foot of sidewalk,
41 with the remainder of such cost to be paid by the City. Property abutting the necessary streets,
42 alleys and public roadways receiving drive approach repair or replacement within the District
43 may be assessed by the square foot of drive approach at the rate of one-half of the total cost of
44 installing or adjusting a square foot of drive approach, with the remainder of such cost to be paid
45 by the City.

46
47 Section 4. The assessment to be levied may be paid in full within thirty (30) days from the
48 levy thereof in the office of the City Director of Finance, and all assessments thereof remaining
49 unpaid at the expiration of said thirty (30) days shall be certified by the Clerk of Council to the
50 County Auditor to be placed by her on the tax duplicate and collected in two (2) semi-annual
51 installments.

52 Section 5. Notice to the owners thereof shall be given by publishing the resolution
53 establishing a sidewalk and drive approach repair or replacement district and setting forth the
54 portion of the cost to be assessed, once each week for two weeks in a newspaper published and
55 of general circulation to the City.
56

57 Section 6. If an owner objects to an assessment, he shall file his objections in writing with
58 the Clerk of Council within ten (10) days after the last publication of the resolution as provided
59 in Section 915.03 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, thereupon, Council
60 shall consider such objections and if they are found to be well taken, may remit such portion of
61 the assessment against the property of the objecting owner as is deemed just or may determine
62 by resolution that a portion or portions of the work described in the ordinance adopted pursuant
63 to Sections 915.01 or 915.02 shall not be done. Any deficiency arising from such remitter may
64 be made up from any fund of the City available for the public improvement of streets or by
65 contributions from the owners desiring that the work be done.
66

67 Section 7. After the expiration of the time within which objections may be filed under Section
68 915.04 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the disposition of objections,
69 the Director of Public Service may proceed with the work mentioned in Sections 915.01 and
70 915.02 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls or if proceeding by contract, the
71 legislative authority shall authorize the Director of Public Service to advertise and take bids for
72 the awarding of the necessary contracts subject to any determination by the Council that a
73 portion or portions of such work shall not be done pursuant to Section 915.04 of the Codified
74 Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls.
75

76 Section 8. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and
77 relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and
78 that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal
79 action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including,
80 to the extent applicable, Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.
81

82 Section 9. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the
83 preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga

14 WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 16 - 2024, a sidewalk and drive approach replacement or
15 adjustment district was created within the City of Cuyahoga Falls for the purpose of replacing or adjusting
16 sidewalks, drive approaches and curbs throughout the City;

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit
19 and State of Ohio, that:

21 Section 1. The Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to enter into a contract or contracts, after
22 publicly advertising for bids, for replacement or adjustment of concrete sidewalks, drive approaches and
23 curbs at various locations in the City of Cuyahoga Falls.

25 Section 2. All bids submitted must conform to and be in accordance with the specifications for the same
26 now on file by mail to the Office of the City Engineer.

28 Section 3. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized to make payment for same from the Capital
29 Projects Fund, line item Capital Outlay.

31 Section 4. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent
32 herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions

7 AN ORDINANCE LEVYING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR THE
8 REPAIR OR REPLACEMENT OF SIDEWALKS AND DRIVE
9 APPROACHES IN THE SIDEWALK AND DRIVE APPROACH REPAIR
10 AND REPLACEMENT DISTRICT, FOR THE YEAR 2025, AND
11 DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

12
13 WHEREAS, Resolution No. 1-2024, created the Sidewalk and Drive Approach Repair and
14 Replacement District for the year 2024, and determined the necessity of adjusting or replacing
15 certain sidewalks and drive approaches within the District; and

16
17 WHEREAS, such sidewalks and drive approaches within the District have been repaired or
18 replaced.

19
20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County
21 of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

22
23 Section 1. The portion of the total cost and expense of repairing or replacing sidewalks and
24 drive approaches located within the Sidewalk and Drive Approach Repair and Replacement
25 District for the year 2025 to be paid for by special assessments is hereby established at the rate
26 of \$22.00 per linear foot for replacement of sidewalks and \$12.00 per square foot for drive
27 approaches. That portion of the total cost of the improvement to be paid for by special
28 assessments is hereby levied and assessed upon the lots and lands provided for in the schedule
29 of special assessments now on file with the Clerk of Council, which special assessments are in
30 proportion to the special benefits and are not in excess of any statutory limitation and which are
31 hereby adopted and confirmed.

32
33 Section 2. The assessment against each lot or parcel of land shall be payable within thirty
34 (30) days from the levy thereof to the office of the Finance Director with the further provision that
35 all assessments thereof remaining unpaid at the expiration of said thirty days shall be certified
36 by the Clerk of Council to the County Fiscal Officer to be placed on the tax duplicate and collected
37 in two (2) semi-annual installments.

38
39 Section 3. A certified copy of this ordinance shall be provided to the County Fiscal Officer by
40 the Clerk of Council within twenty (20) days after its passage.

41
42 Section 4. Any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions
43 inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent
44 herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

8 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, OHIO
9 SUPPORTING THE OHIO COMMISSION FOR THE UNITED
10 STATES SEMIQUINCENTENNIAL (AMERICA 250-OH).

12 WHEREAS, the Ohio legislature and the Governor created AMERICA 250-OH in 2018
13 to plan, encourage, develop and coordinate the commemoration of the 250th anniversary
14 of the United States and Ohio’s integral role in that event and the role of its people on the
15 nation’s past, present, and future; and

17 WHEREAS, AMERICA 250-OH hopes to engage all Ohioans and all 88 counties
18 through their many signature and officially recognized programs, projects, and events
19 over the next several years by inspiring future leaders and celebrating all Ohioans
20 contributions to the nation over the last 250 years; and

22 WHEREAS, by adoption of AMERICA 250-OH Resolution the City desires to educate,
23 preserve innovate, and celebrate Ohioans.

25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls,
26 County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

28 Section 1. The City of Cuyahoga Falls officially endorses AMERICA 250-OH and its
29 mission to educate, preserve, innovate, and celebrate every Ohioan in every county.

30
31 Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council
32 concerning and relating to the acceptance of this resolution were adopted in an open
33 meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its
34 committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in
35 compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107
36 of the Codified Ordinances.

38 Section 3. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary
39 for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the
40 City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it receives the
41 affirmative vote of two thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take
42 effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise
43 it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
